HELP

Clarence Lee, a housekeeper at Tacoma General Hospital for the past 9 years, has touched many lives at the hospital with his quick smile and friendly ways. In June 2005, he was diagnosed with kidney failure and needs a kidney transplant.

He has undergone Peritoneal dialysis 3 times a day, every day, while a search for a donor was underway, and has still managed to work his scheduled hours. A donor has been found - out of town. Virginia Mason, in Seattle, has agreed to cover the cost of the transplant, but the Lee family must pay for transportation of the donor family to Seattle, plus lodging for themselves, and the donor family, in Seattle for approx. 6 weeks after the surgery.

The Lee's are also in need of a reliable vehicle to get them back & forth to the numerous medical appointments in Seattle.

The staff at Tacoma General along with Round Table Pizza, and Cold Stone Creamery, have been holding various events to raise funds for the Lee family, and people have been generous, but there is still a long way to go for the funds needed by the Lee family.
